



Introducing CrossTraining Toronto!



“CrossTraining - Toronto” is an innovative program integrating hands-on experience, academic study and personal mentorship, with a strong emphasis on personal spiritual development. CrossTraining is a proven model of cross-cultural ministry training in the context of the urban church providing participants with both structure and flexibility.

What makes CrossTraining Unique & Compelling?

Character Focused: CrossTraining seeks to develop and enhance Christ-like character in its participants.

Mentor-Based: CrossTraining seeks to foster a meaningful relationship between students and mentors. Mentors include ethnic pastors, field missionaries, and local retired missionaries. Mentors are encouragers, willing to walk alongside a student as a teacher, listener and friend. They will share their life failures and successes with the learner.

Undergraduate Education: CrossTraining can be taken as part of a B.R.E. and B.Th. in Global/Intercultural Studies through Emmanuel & Heritage Bible Colleges.

Graduate Education: Up to 30 credit hours can be transferred towards a M.Div. through Heritage Seminary.

Church-Centered: CrossTraining involves the participant in ministry within a Canadian ethnic church in an urban setting. Ethnic churches in the Calgary-Toronto area will “adopt” a student and provide opportunities to serve, learn, and grow in their midst.

Experiential: CrossTraining provides hands-on ministry opportunities in both a local ethnic setting and an overseas cross-cultural setting.

Spiritual Development: CrossTraining places a high value on personal spiritual development. Participants will meet weekly to interact on issues of spiritual health and maturity.

What makes CrossTraining Unique & Compelling?

- “Kingdom learners” who are ready to develop a cross-cultural understanding and adeptness
- Increased global perspective and aptitude for engaging in other cultures
- Experience and equipping for the dynamics of urban living and ministry
- Personal mentorship-based growth that leads to further character development
- Enhanced appreciation for the global church
- Preparation for a life of sacrificial service to God

Term One: Ethnic Church in Toronto September - December 2006

Participants will be assigned to an ethnic church where they will be exposed to 10-15 hrs of ministry in a cross-cultural context under the supervision of a qualified mentor. During Term One, participants will take three one-week training modules for credit plus the weekly global perspective seminars (12 hours from Heritage College & Seminary and Emmanuel Bible College) or for non-credit.

Heritage Seminary will grant 21 Credit hours towards their two year MTS and a full year (30 credit hours) toward a 3 year M.Div.

Term Two: Overseas Internship with Partner Mission January – April 2007

CrossTraining will assist participants to find an overseas ministry assignment with a partner mission. This assignment will expose participants to ministry in a cross-cultural context under the supervision and mentorship of a mature national and missionary. Potential credit for overseas assignment.

Academic Options

- M.Div. from Heritage Seminary (up to 30 credit hours)
- M.T.S. from Heritage Seminary (up to 21 credit hours)
- B.R.E. or B.Th. from Emmanuel Bible College and Heritage College (Up to 30 credit hours)

CrossTraining Certificate Options

One year stand-alone option may be taken for academic credit or as a stand-alone certificate.

Ministry Enhancement Options (Credit or Audit)

Any combination of modular courses or seminars may be taken to enhance global awareness and sharpen intercultural ministry skills.

Tuition Fees

- BRE or Bth with a Missions Major (full-time, academic credit participant)
Tuition = \$225/credit hour. 27 credits are required to qualify for the MA Option:
 $27 \times \$225 = \6075 .
- CrossTraining Credits (21 Hours) can be transferred towards an MTS or Mdiv at Heritage Seminary
- One Year Stand-Alone Option (A full-time participant not enrolled in a degree program)
Tuition = \$134/credit hour. $27 \times \$134 = \3618 .
- Ministry Enhancement Option (Audit for personal interest)
Tuition = \$100/credit hour to audit courses.

Other Potential Costs

- Books: Approximately \$400.00
- Toronto Room & Board: The standard student room and board fee in Toronto is \$600-700/mth, public transit, phone and other personal costs
- Overseas Room & Board: approximately \$2500 (can be paid through donation to partner mission)
- Overseas Airfare: Anywhere from \$1500-\$2500 (can be paid through donation to partner mission)
